Lincoln Community News

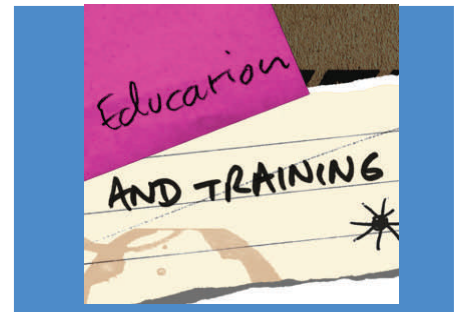

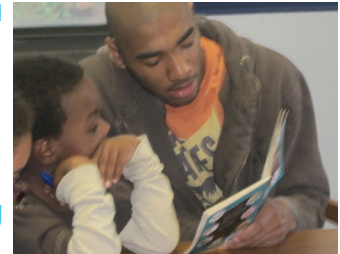


Youth Ministry
